- ▶ Take in the majestic beauty of our natural wonder of the world as you tour **Three Sisters Islands, Horseshoe Falls at Terrapin Point, American Falls at Prospect Point**, and **Bridal Veil Falls on Luna Island**. - ▶ The **Buffalo and Erie County Naval & Military Park** features three WWII ships and a variety of military equipment and exhibits.

- ▶ In the 1900s, the **Herschell Carrousel Factory Museum** was a working factory of children's rides. Now, visitors can learn about the history of carrouseles, see the way they are made, and ride an original antique Herschell carrousel!
- ▶ See a play that's fun for all ages at **Theater of Youth**.

- ▶ See a world-class performance at **Shea's Performing Arts Center**.
- ▶ See if you can spot all of the more than 2,000 angels at the European style Italian Renaissance cathedral of **Our Lady of Victory Basilica & National Shrine**.
- ▶ Enjoy a relaxing day of shopping in the **Elmwood Village**, located in the heart of the city. If you get hungry, it's a great “lunch on your own” stop.
- ▶ Take a Buffalo City Tour which can include a visit to the **Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural National Historic Site** and an array of architecture by **Frank Lloyd Wright, Louis Sullivan, E.B. Green, and H.H. Richardson**.



- ▶ For the true lover of Frank Lloyd Wright's work, the **Blue Sky Mausoleum** at Forest Lawn Cemetery is an impressive example of funerary art.
- ▶ The **Buffalo Transportation/Pierce-Arrow Museum**, featuring Buffalo-made automobiles, bicycles, and other memorabilia is the soon-to-be home of the Frank Lloyd Wright Filling Station.
- ▶ View the impressive 20th century and modern-day painting and sculpture collection at the **Albright-Knox Art Gallery**.
- ▶ If you visit during the summer, take a trip to **Artpark**, a performance venue situated on 150 acres along the Niagara River Gorge.
- ▶ Tour the **Buffalo & Erie County Botanical Gardens**, the most intact Frederick Law Olmsted Landscape and arboretum in the country.
- ▶ On a **Buffalo Harbor Cruise**, take in the majestic sights as you sail on three different bodies of water: Lake Erie, the Niagara River, and the Black Rock Lock & Canal System.
- ▶ See the work of Western New York's own art and artists at the **Burchfield Penney Art Center**, located in the heart of the Museum District.
- ▶ Visit the **Buffalo Central Terminal**, an Art Deco style station, currently undergoing a restoration.

- ▶ Visit during June & July and participate in the **National Garden Festival**, featuring garden walks, open gardens, lectures, workshops and a Front Yard Garden Competition.
- ▶ Art and theater mix with nature at **Artpark**, a green space of 150 acres on the Niagara River Gorge and one of Western New York's premier visual and performing arts destinations.
- ▶ Hike, swim, attend a nature program, or just pause to take in the scenery as you make your way through **Letchworth State Park**.
- ▶ Ride the Virtual Gorge Elevator at the **Niagara Gorge Discovery Center** to see the rock layers formed millions of years ago and learn how Niagara Falls was formed.
- ▶ Explore **Niagara Falls State Park**, experience the Falls from an arm's length away at the **Cave of the Winds**, and take a scenic ride on the **Maid of the Mist** Boat Tours.
- ▶ Then get ready for the thrilling ride down the rapids of the gorge on **Whirlpool Jet Boat Tours**.
- ▶ Feed a seal and tour the **Aquarium of Niagara**.

- ▶ Take a break from walking to enjoy a 1900s style train ride through countryside and farmlands aboard the **Arcade & Attica Railroad**.
- ▶ Visit **Spring Lake Winery**, **Freedom Run Winery**, or another of Niagara County's wineries for a tour and tasting.
- ▶ See the **Holland Land Office Museum**, where 3.3 million acres of Western New York were surveyed and sold.

HISTORICAL TREASURES TOUR

PROGRAM INCLUDES

- ▶ The **Amherst Museum** features indoor and outdoor tours of local historic buildings and hands-on exhibits about life in previous centuries.
- ▶ For an institution devoted to preserving the history of the Queen City, visit the **Buffalo & Erie County Historical Society**. Even the building is an artifact—it's the only remaining permanent structure from the Pan American Exposition in 1901.
- ▶ Any WWII buffs on board? Don't miss the **Buffalo and Erie County Naval & Military Park**, the largest inland park of its kind in the nation.
- ▶ Few inventions have impacted our lives as much as the automobile. The **Buffalo Transportation/Pierce Arrow Museum** features a number of automobiles manufactured right here in Buffalo.
- ▶ The automobile wasn't the only form of transportation that changed lives. Take a two hour boat ride along the Erie Canal with **Lockport Locks and Erie Canal Cruises**. Then visit the interactive exhibits at the **Erie Canal Discovery Center**.
- ▶ History comes alive at **Old Fort Niagara**, featuring a real 18th century fortress with original stone buildings and fortifications. While you're there, participate in a musket demonstration, or be recruited to King George III's royal army.
- ▶ More than one hundred years ago history was made on Delaware Avenue. The **Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural National Historic Site** is a must-see site in Buffalo.
- ▶ Plan to stop at the **Karpeles Manuscript Library Museum** to see a number of historic documents from the world's largest private collection.
- ▶ The **Buffalo Central Terminal**, an art deco style train station was completed in 1929.



- ▶ Tour the home of a former president when you visit the **Millard Fillmore Museum**. Then travel to another domestic site, the **Elbert Hubbard-Roycroft Museum**, a Craftsman-style home built in 1910.

ADDITIONAL OPTIONS

- ▶ Celebrate the rich history of African Americans at the **African American Cultural Center**. Stop by in the evening to see a production at the **Paul Robeson** or **Ujima** theatres.
- ▶ Take time to stop and smell the roses at the Frederick Law Olmsted-designed landscape and arboretum at the **Buffalo & Erie County Botanical Gardens**.
- ▶ The Buffalo Niagara region played a vital role in the escape of former slaves. Learn all about it with the **Freedom Crossing: The Underground Railroad** in Greater Niagara exhibit at the Castellani Art Museum.
- ▶ The **Herschell Carousel Factory Museum** was once a working factory and leading producer of carrouseles and children's rides. Now, it is a tribute to the industry, with an original, antique Herschell Carrousel visitors can ride on-site.
- ▶ The Rev. J. Edward Nash helped to organize the Niagara Movement, a forerunner to the NAACP. See his home and a collection of artifacts and papers at the **Nash House Museum**.
- ▶ Tour the one hundred year old **Original American Kazoo Company** and make your very own kazoo!
- ▶ The recently renovated **Riviera Theater and Performing Arts Center** is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Don't miss the 1926 Mighty Wurlitzer organ.

EXPERIENTIAL EDU-EXCURSION

- ▶ The Pan American Exposition of 1901 exhibit is a must-see at the **Buffalo & Erie County Historical Society**. In fact, the building the Historical Society is housed in is the only remaining permanent structure from the event.
- ▶ See a variety of Buffalo-made automobiles, bicycles, and other memorabilia in the **Buffalo Transportation/Pierce-Arrow Museum**, and the **Frank Lloyd Wright Filling Station**.
- ▶ Relax and spend an evening of instrumental bliss with the **Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra**.
- ▶ Tour one of Frank Lloyd Wright's architectural masterpieces, the **Darwin Martin House** or **Graycliff Estate**.
- ▶ Spend a few hours at the **Herschell Carrousel Factory Museum** and tour what was once a working factory and leading producer of carrouseles and children's rides.

- ▶ Learning opportunities abound at the **Penn Dixie Paleontological & Outdoor Education Center**. Learners of all ages can enjoy classes and hands on activities in fossil collecting, geology, birding, astronomy, wetlands, and the natural sciences.
- ▶ Spend some time outside at **Brown's Berry Patch** or **Becker Farms** where you can pick your own fruit!
- ▶ Take part in musket demonstrations, see Revolutionary War reenactments, military living demonstrations, and more at **Old Fort Niagara**.
- ▶ Go behind the scenes in Coca-Cola Field during the **Buffalo Bisons Baseball** "Back of the House" Tour. Then root for the home team!
